God inspired 44 different people from all different backgrounds, countries, and walks of life over a period of 1,600 years to write the Bible.

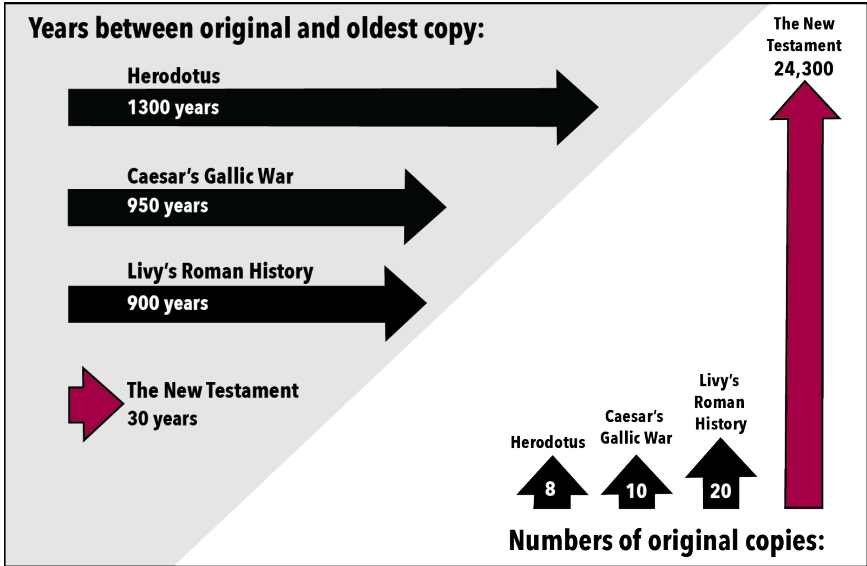
HOW DID WE GET THE BIBLE?

Some people wonder how we can trust that the Bible is what the original authors wrote. There is evidence inside and outside of the Bible of its validity.

TEXTUAL CRITICISM

We can be confident in the Bible through a science called Textual Criticism. When you read a book that is a copy of an ancient manuscript, you can ask

two questions to decipher if it's accurate. The first - how quickly after the original did someone make a copy? The second - how many copies are there?



Based on the short time between the original and oldest copy, as well as the large amount of original copies, we know that the Bible is accurate and is what the original authors wrote.

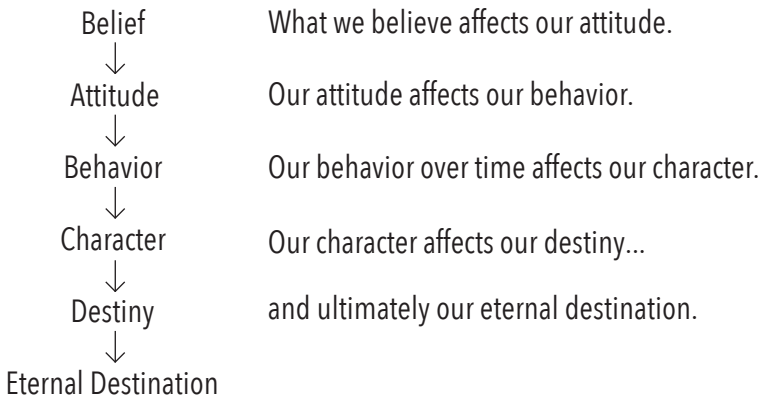
THE NATURE OF GOD

God is a Father

God has a reason for everything He does and a purpose for everything He creates. What He does is always consistent with who He is. Of all the descriptions of God in the Bible, the most all-inclusive one is the title "Father." His Father's heart motivated Him to create mankind so He could have a family. Let's read Genesis 1:26-28 again and see the four-fold purpose for mankind in creation. Fill them in below:

As you can see, fulfilling our God-given destiny starts with a relationship with God. It's only from having a relationship with God through Jesus Christ that we can become like Him and live the way we were created to live.

1. Relationship - "Let Us make man..."

God wanted a family of children to share life with and get to know in a personal way (Genesis 1:26).

2. Reflection or Character - "in Our image, according to Our likeness..."

God wanted His children to look like Him on the inside, to bear the family "image and likeness" (Genesis 1:26).

3. Rulership - "and let them rule..."

God wanted His children to share in the family business (Genesis 1:26).

4. Reproduction - "Be fruitful and multiply..."

God wanted His children to reproduce more children to be in the family (Genesis 1:28).

WHAT DO THESE VERSES SHOW US ABOUT GOD AS A FATHER?

The only way that any of us will be able to find fulfillment in life is to discover the reasons why we were created. Just as using a saw to hammer nails or trying to use a car to fly will not be successful, so mankind living for reasons other than those God intended will only lead to frustration and failure.

God is Just

God's love is completely just, and His justice is completely loving. In other words, God's love works together with His justice. God must rule justly in order to maintain His perfect righteousness, which is the foundation of His throne (Psalm 89:14). However, God is also merciful; therefore, He desires to forgive our sins. Since God is righteous, He cannot forgive sin arbitrarily or unfairly. He must forgive sin in a way that satisfies His justice and His mercy at the same time.

ADDITIONAL SCRIPTURES & DEFINITIONS

- Other gods - Any person or thing that is given a title or place of a god to which power is attributed. Any "god" besides the Lord God of the Bible
- Idolatry - The worship of anything that is not God (idols, images, anything man-made); excessive attachment or veneration for anything other than God
- Vanity - Emptiness, worthlessness; the quality of having no substance, value, or importance
- Sabbath - Intermission, cease, desist from labor, rest, to sit still
- Honor - To glorify
- Murder - Slay, kill, hate

Death does not mean ceasing to exist; rather, it means a separation from the source of life. In Genesis 2:15-17, God told Adam and Eve they would die. This meant they would be separated from God, who is the source of life. According to the Bible, there are 3 types of death:

Physical Death: separation of soul & spirit from the body. (Heb 9:27)

Spiritual Death: separation of man from God (Eph 2:1)

Eternal Death: separation of man from God for eternity (Hell). (Matthew 13:40-43)

This is our great problem. All of us are born spiritually dead, separated from God, and if we die physically in that state, we'll experience Eternal Death and be in Hell forever.

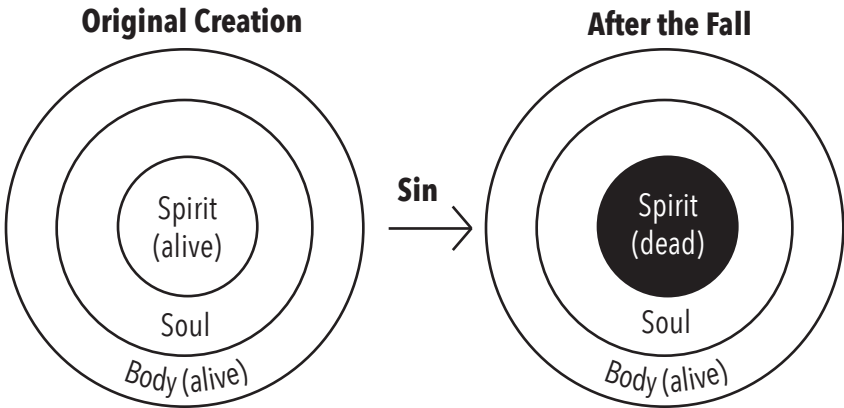
The Bible teaches that man is a spirit, has a soul, and lives in a body.

The **body** is the senses or world-conscious part of man.

The dilemma for all of mankind is that we are born physically alive and spiritually dead.

CHAPTER 4

THE PRICE GOD PAID

STUDENT STORY

"One day I was challenged to try and picture what Jesus went through in His death on the cross. As I sat there and thought about His sacrifice, I was almost brought to tears. After the magnitude of that sunk in, I began to consider how sinful I was and how I didn't deserve that sacrifice. Jesus died for my sin, and my response to that was... well... pathetic. I gave in to sin time and time again, yet felt very little remorse. I needed to change, and decided to look at the concept of repentance differently."

God determined the just punishment for sin was death (eternal separation from His presence). Since all men have sinned, they all deserve to be punished. But God did not want to send man to hell.

Redemption - The action of regaining or gaining possession of something in exchange for payment, or clearing a debt.

Reconciliation - To restore two parties who are at odds back into agreement and relationship.

All of mankind is held captive by sin resulting in death. In order for God to repurchase our lives from spiritual death and into life, a price had to be paid...

"Just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many [paying the price to set them free from the penalty of sin]." - Matthew 20:28 AMP

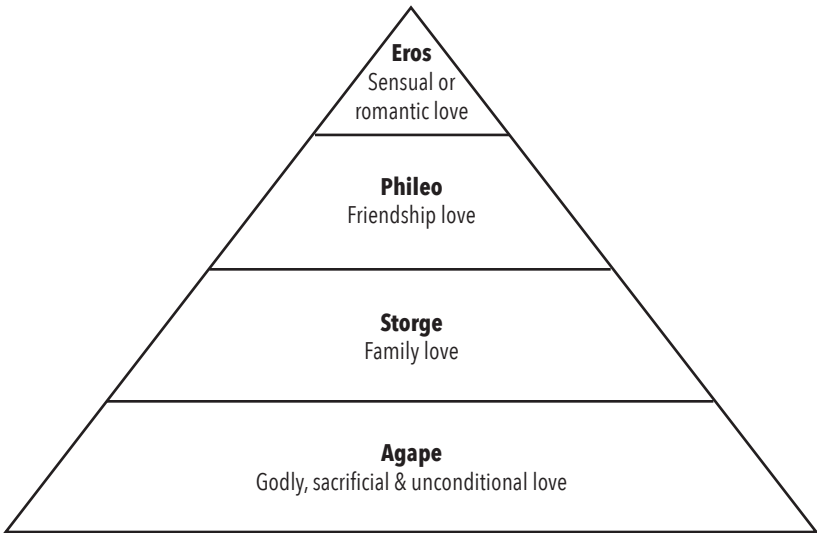

DID YOU KNOW?

According to the Bible, there are four different kinds of love:



God's Agape love was on display when He chose to create us and later die for us. This kind of love does not originate in the human heart, it only comes from a relationship with God through Jesus Christ. God's love is the foundation on which relationships should be built.

SCRIPTURES TO CONSIDER

Read 1 John 4:7-10 and John 3:16-18.

WHAT DO THESE VERSES TELL US ABOUT GOD?

God chose to give His life as full payment toward the penalty of death in exchange for our lives (redemption). He did this because of His great love for us in order to restore us into relationship with Him (reconciliation).

Read Isaiah 53:3-10

HOW DOES IT MAKE YOU FEEL TO KNOW THAT JESUS DIED FOR YOU REGARDLESS OF WHETHER OR NOT YOU CHOOSE TO FOLLOW HIM?

Even though Jesus died a painful death to pay for our sins, He was pleased to offer His life because of His love for us. This is the good news of the Bible.

God devised a plan that placed the death penalty for sin upon the only person in the universe who could take your place, God Himself, the Lord Jesus Christ. Though Jesus didn't deserve it, He suffered and died on the cross in our place, providing the only way for you and I to have eternal life and go to heaven.²

Christ's death and resurrection enables us to be forgiven for our sins and gives us the power to no longer be controlled by sin.²

CHAPTER 5

GOD'S SOLUTION

STUDENT STORY

"When I got to CSU, I started living a destructive lifestyle of drinking, sex and drugs. Although I knew about the Bible, I didn't fully understand what it meant to be a Christian. Thankfully, a friend of mine helped me realize that the way I was living was holding me back from having a real relationship with God. After counting the cost of whether it was worth the changes I'd have to make to follow Jesus, I decided to repent and put my trust in Him."

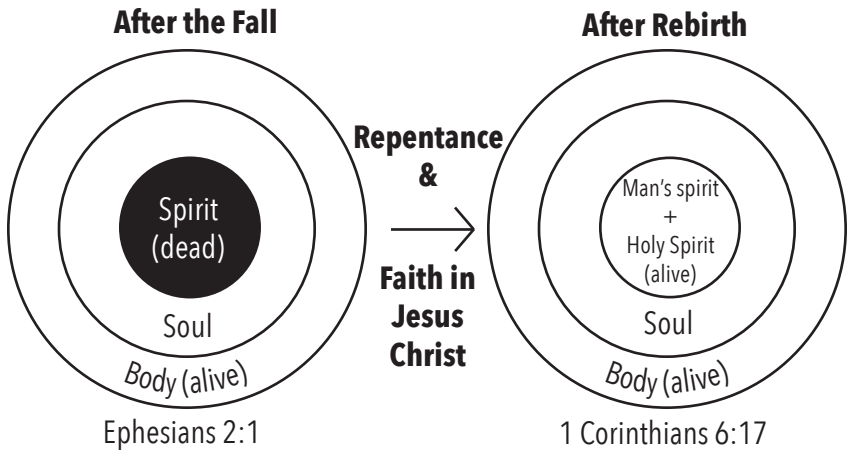
Take this opportunity to examine the three essentials of salvation - humility, submission and faith. Some people have a "conversion" experience, but can only identify with one or two of these aspects.

For example, believing that Jesus died for your sin but not acknowledging that you individually are a sinner destined for hell will not produce a true conversion.

Likewise, confessing sin on a day to day basis without ever submitting to Jesus as the Lord of your life will result in frustration without change.

If you do not actually believe that the blood of Jesus saved you and only hope it did, then you do not really have faith. Faith is the assurance of what God has said.

Read 2 Corinthians 5:17



Remember, we are born physically alive but spiritually dead. When we make the decision to repent from a life lived independently from God, follow Jesus with our lives, and stop trusting in our own efforts to please Him and instead put our faith in what He did for us on the cross, we are spiritually born again.

ADDITIONAL SCRIPTURES & DEFINITIONS

- Lord - A lord is a master, king, captain or controller. It is the title of the one whose words have final authority, marked by obedience of ones they are lord over. When capitalized, it refers to the Lord God of all the earth
- Partiality - Favoritism. An inclination to favor one party or one side of a question more than the other; an undue bias of mind toward one party or one side
- Prodigal - Given to extravagant expenditures; expending money or other things without necessity; profuse, lavish
- Ephesians 2:1-10
- Colossians 3:3

HOW TO FOLLOW JESUS

In order to receive what Jesus Christ has done for you, you must willingly:

1. Stop trusting in your own efforts to please God and begin to trust in what Jesus Christ has already done.
2. Ask Him to forgive you for your sins.
3. Invite Him to come and live inside of you.
4. Ask Him to take His rightful place as Lord and God of your life.
5. Turn away from whatever the Bible says is sin. (This is only possible after Christ has come to live inside of you.)²

When you turn from your sins and trust in Jesus, there will be a supernatural change in your heart which the Bible calls, being “born again.” Our good works will never get us into heaven.²

You may invite Jesus to come and live inside of you by sincerely praying the following prayer out loud:

“Lord Jesus, I want to stop trusting in myself and what I can do and start trusting in You and what You have already done when You died for me on the cross. I know that I am a sinner and I am sorry for my sins. I ask You to forgive me and I invite You to come and live inside of me. I want You to be my Savior and my Lord, which means being #1 in my life. I want to repent and turn away from everything You and the Bible call sin and I totally commit myself to obeying You everyday, for the rest of my life. Thank You Jesus.”²

In order for your new personal relationship with God to grow, it is essential that you:²

- Spend some time each day praying and worshipping God. 1 Thess. 5:17-18
- Read the Bible daily. 1 Peter 2:2
- Find a church that teaches the Bible as 100% the Word of God and encourages a personal relationship with Jesus. Hebrews 10:25
- Begin to develop friendships with sincere Christians and be baptized.

1 John 1:7, Romans 6:4

- Tell other people about your new relationship with God. Matt. 4:19

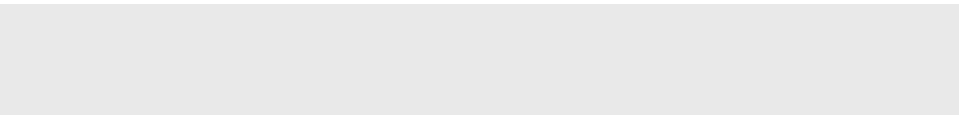
